

# Learning Support

St Anne's Catholic School believes in providing an inclusive education and that all students' have the ability to learn, contribute and achieve.

Teacher's and the school strive to provide a curriculum and environment that recognises all students' identities, languages, cultures and talents.

The systems, processes and practices are flexible and responsive to the individual needs of our students. The Special Educational Needs Coordinator (SENCo) at St Anne's Catholic School is Mr Matthew Norman one of the Associate Principals, it is his role to ensure that all our students are getting the right learning support to meet their individual needs.



At school the students' receive great learning support and this comes in a variety of different ways. The Associate Principals Mrs Milich-Misikini and Mr Norman are responsible for looking after our dedicated and skilled [Learning Support, Quick 60](#) (Reading) and [English Language Assistants](#) (ELA) teams. These teams support a variety of children with their learning, behaviour, reading, language & health. Mr Norman is responsible for the Learning Support Team and Mrs Milich-Misikini is responsible for the Quick 60 and ELA teams.

Our focus as a school this year is unpacking what it means to be “Called and Chosen”.


From the beginning of time, when light broke through the darkness for the first time, and God was beginning to create the rest of the universe, solar system and the earth we live on, He was thinking of us. We are chosen by God.

*“Just as He chose us in Him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and without blame before Him in love.” Ephesians 1:4.*

This means that God was thinking about us before He created the earth. In love, He chose us to be His children when our time on earth would come. So He has had more than enough time to reconsider! He knew about our human weaknesses long before we were born, and knows them better than we know them ourselves – but despite this He has not changed His mind.

The phrase “chosen by God” is used in a variety of ways. The Bible is very clear that there are people chosen by God to do specific things. This simply means at some point God made the choice for something to happen according to His perfect wisdom, foreknowledge, and will. Because of this, God’s choices are perfect and will result in the fulfillment of His perfect will.

#### Social Workers in schools have three main roles:

1. One-to-one work with children and their whanau.
2. Provide group programmes which help children and families to succeed.
3. Help children and families to access community support and networks.

#### Here are some of the things we can work on with you and your child:

- Social skills, self-esteem and confidence.
- Making friends and positive relationships.
- Family/ whanau relationships.
- Behavioural concerns.
- Advocate on your behalf to agencies (Taikura Trust, Oranga Tamariki, Housing New Zealand etc) helping to support your child/whanau.
- Access to parenting programmes, counselling services and financial mentoring.
- Access to parent support and community services.
- Access food parcels.
- Referrals to other services.
- School engagement.
- Transitions to new schools.
- Helping to fill out important documents regarding your child.

#### Who can refer?

- Self referrals – Kids might ask for some support. Then Eloise would contact the family.
- Parents can make a referral to work with Eloise.
- Teachers can talk to the SENCO/DP and make a referral.
