South Auckland Catholic Schools Kahui Ako update

St Anne's School is a part of the South Auckland Catholic Schools Community of Learning-Kahui Ako. The Kahui Ako started in 2017 and has had a focus around lifting achievement for our students in writing and mathematics. We have seen some good progress across the Kahui Ako. Our Kahui Ako consists of 8 primary schools and 2 high schools. At St Anne's we have 3 In school Lead teachers and 1 Across Lead teacher. They have been working within our school to support students and teachers within the writing and mathematics programmes to promote student agency and a responsive curriculum.

Recent Professional Development for the In school and Across school Lead Teachers took a slight change from its normal structure of external facilitation with the Kahu Ako Across school Lead Teachers facilitating an afternoon, followed by a day of workshops facilitated by the In school Lead teachers.



In this Gospel reading, the sense of the definition "stage actor" comes through very loudly. The Pharisees put a great emphasis on the external when it came to observing rituals and laws, as related in many parts of the Gospels, and this is no different. The laws handed down from Moses were intended to help keep the Israelites pure by using externals to emphasize internal spiritual cleanliness, Jesus instructs, but the modern Israelites had forgotten the latter while clinging to the former.

When the Pharisees questioned him about the actions of the disciples (not washing their hands before eating), Jesus told them that there were more important things for his disciples to do. His disciples were busy telling people about God and the love of God. Their hearts were in the right place. Doing God's work with a clean and loving heart.

The Pharisees and scribes had made many laws that were supposed to help the Jews obey God's law. After a time it became more important to obey their own laws than those of God.

You know with some vegetables you eat the leaves and the outside. With an artichoke you got to eat the heart. It's the best bit. The best of religion is in the heart. Religion is of the heart. Jesus today talks a lot about that – lip service and hearts far from him.

The people who were wondering about the bits and pieces were sincere. They kept the law but then were intolerant of weakness in others. They missed often on people's goodness and so they talked of people who didn't wash hands, cups and God knows what else.

The heart of religion is found in the heart of God - Love – "when you love do not say God is in my heart – say I am in the heart of God". Let us get 'busy' sharing the love of God and following God with our hearts.
