- Parking on the grass between the road and footpath

- Stopping on yellow lines to release our children

Myron has been riding and racing bikes since the age of 3. He started in BMX and then moved onto racing on the road and in the velodrome. He has represented New Zealand at the Junior World Championships receiving the Silver Medal in Mexico 2007 and placed fourth in the 1000m time trial at the 2010 Commonwealth Games in Delhi. He has travelled and raced all over the world with cycling, finishing a digital film diploma along the way! Myron created his own muesli company in 2013 called 'Myron's Muesli', and in 2016 he travelled through South America on his own and was lucky enough to work for New Zealand companies Moa Beer and Mr Vintage at the Olympic Games in Rio, Brazil. In 2018 Myron went to the Commonwealth Games on the Gold Coast as a team supporter for the athletes and he now works for cycling New Zealand coaching some of NZ's up and coming cyclists.


