

## Pope's August prayer intention: people in the maritime world



The Pope's Worldwide Prayer Network, formerly known as the Apostleship of Prayer, organises and disseminates "The Pope Video". The network is a pontifical initiative, whose mission is to pray and encounter the challenges facing humanity and the mission of the Church that concern the Holy Father, expressed in his monthly intentions.

In his prayer intention for this month of August, Pope Francis urges prayers for seafarers and those working in the maritime world. He released a [video](#) last Tuesday with the message containing his prayer intention for the month of August. He invites prayers for those "who work and live from the sea, among them sailors, fishermen and their families".

"The life of sailors or fishermen and their families is very difficult," Pope Francis notes in the video message in his native Spanish language. "Sometimes they are victims of forced labor or are left behind in distant ports. The competition of industrial fishing and the problem of pollution make their work even more complicated." However, the Pope admits, "without the people of the sea, many parts of the world would starve. Let us pray for all those who work and live from the sea, among them sailors, fishermen and their families," the Pope urges.

As a country surrounded by water and with our Pasefika neighbours, many of us survive or make a living from fishing. I know that my extended family back in Savaii, Samoa continue to work and live from the sea as lots of other people's relatives in the islands do. A few children in the Hub have shared that they have family members that are fishermen.

Let us, as the Pope urges, dedicate this month in praying for all fishermen and their families and those who live and make a living from the sea.


