A reminder: It is now **Week 5 of Term 2**- all students should be wearing the correct St Anne's Catholic School winter uniform as shown above.

Our school uniform is sold online at www.argyleonline.co.nz - click on Shop ArgyleOnLine and select our school name under the Auckland heading. The online instructions are easy to follow, orders can be placed anytime and you can pay using a Credit or Debit card or online banking. Orders are expected to be delivered within 3-5 working days to the address you choose.

Other items of uniform:

- Only black or brown shoes should be worn in winter months (Term 2 & Term 3)
- Earrings - should be studs only.
- Children with long hair should have it tied up in a black, white or navy hair tie/clip/headband.
- No nail polish to be worn at school
- No nose rings or anklets are permitted in our policy.
- Greenstone, crosses, crucifixes are fine to be worn under the shirt.
 - Children are able to wear culturally significant items **ONLY** if they bring to school a letter from an elder, church minister etc - family items are not to be worn.

At St Anne's Catholic School we have a limited selection of 2nd hand uniforms, these are available at the library and you will need to speak with the office staff first. We greatly appreciate any donations of 2nd hand uniforms and these can be left at the office also.
