Attendance Dues

SCHOOL DUES – 2023 FULL YEAR

- Parents/Caregivers, as a condition of enrolment and attendance, are required to pay compulsory Attendance Dues as determined from time to time by the Proprietor and approved by the Minister of Education.
- Accounts are emailed and sent home with your child each term.

1. ATTENDANCE DUES – Compulsory for every student

\$122.00 per term, per child (\$488.00 per year)

Please ensure that you make regular payments, as the Attendance Dues are COMPULSORY.

2. SPECIAL CHARACTER CONTRIBUTION

Special Character Contributions collected on behalf of the Proprietor are permitted under the terms of the Education and Training Act 2020. These contributions are eligible for a taxation rebate.

WHAT HAPPENS DURING A LITERACY LESSON?

IN BETTER START LITERACY

SHARED BOOK

The weekly book is read and specific vocabulary is highlighted. The story is then segmented into parts such as character, setting, and problem. Children then retell the story.



THE SOUND OF THE DAY

Children look at a letter or group of letters and learn the sound. They then look at words beginning with that sound.

SEGMENTING

Words are broken up into sounds and children practice the sounds. For example hop has 3 sounds; m-o-p.



PHYSICAL MANIPULATION

Children are given the opportunity to physically manipulate the sounds and create new words. This may be done with letter tiles and whiteboards.

SMALL GROUP READING

Children will read in small groups with their teacher to develop them further. Follow up tasks may be also be done.
