Aotearoa New Zealand Histories

This term we began teaching the new Aotearoa NZ Histories Curriculum with our pupils. It has been a really exciting new piece of learning for pupils and staff. It is wonderful that we get to explore our very own history. Pupils get to know and discuss history from many perspectives, with an emphasis on mātauranga Māori.

Literacy Programmes

Last week there was discussion around what is an effective reading programme. A structured literacy approach is the preferred programme for years 0-2 students by the Ministry of Education. We have been developing this within the school since 2022 with Christchurch University. All our Year 0-2 teachers are training in a programme called BSLA, Better Start Literacy Approach. We are seeing great results with our pupils with their phonemic skills (ability to identify and manipulate individual sounds). This will help students in their reading.


