- 3) Never give out your passwords
- 4) Don't befriend people you don't know
- 5) Remember that not everyone online is who they say they are
- 6) Think carefully about what you say before you post something online
- 7) Respect other people's views, even if you don't agree with someone else's views doesn't mean you need to be rude
- If you see something online that makes you feel uncomfortable, unsafe or worried: leave the website, turn off your computer if you want to and tell a trusted adult immediately.



This week we celebrate the Feast of the coming of Pentecost otherwise known as the birth of the Church.

At Pentecost, the Apostles and their followers were gathered in a room. Jews from all over the world were gathered with Peter, the leader of the Apostles and the Eleven. At this time, a great wind blew and a flame appeared as a tongue of fire, which split itself into many individual flames above the heads of all those present. The Holy Spirit came upon these people and each began to speak in tongues. Despite the fact many had no common language, they were perfectly able to understand one another. It was through Christ's gift of the Holy Spirit, that gave Peter and the Apostles courage to start spreading the Good News. On that day Peter called all those present to be baptized and about three thousand people were baptized that day. These people were among the first Catholics, and Peter is the first pope of the Catholic Church.

The symbols of Pentecost are the flame, wind, and the dove, which represents the Holy Spirit. The colour of Pentecost is red and the priest wears red vestments on this day. Red decorations at celebrations are appropriate, similar to any other birthday. Special prayers are often said just for Pentecost. Although we celebrate our own birthdays, Pentecost is also our second birthday because we are part of the body of the Church. So let us make sure we celebrate this week. Happy birthday to the Catholic Church! Happy birthday to all of us who are blessed to be a part of this wonderful church of ours.

## Coming together for our Whanau



Tena koutou katoa, on the evening of Monday 14th May a small but enthusiastic group of Maori whanau attended a hui discussing the progress of the school with things Maori over the past two years. Whanau and student voice has enabled the school to implement a St Anne's Catholic School Te Reo Maori Draft plan and a Kapa Haka plan which has been put into place this year. We discussed and shared the great achievements of our Maori student data from 2017. The government target for students is for 80% of students to reach the standard in Reading, Writing and Mathematics. We were pleased to celebrate Maori students achievement was above the government targets which is very exciting for our whanau: Reading 83%, Writing 81%, Maths 92%. We look forward to seeing the same/similar results for our students and their whanau in 2018 and your continued support of our tamariki throughout the year and especially for a Kapa haka visit to Manurewa Marae (30th July) and Te Wiki o te reo Maori (10 - 16th September).
