
When Mary said "I am the Lord's servant, may it happen to me as you have said" (Luke 1: 38) God's divine plan for mankind came into fruition. Mary's love, trust and obedience to God sets an example for us all.

For centuries, the Catholic Church has set aside the entire month of May to honor Mary, Mother of God. Not just a day in May, but the entire month.

The month of May is the "month which the piety of the faithful has especially dedicated to Our Blessed Lady". During this month Christians, both in church and in the privacy of the home, offer up to

Mary from their hearts an especially fervent and loving homage of prayer and veneration. The Blessed Virgin Mary is the Mother of the Church and therefore the example, as well as the guide and inspiration, of everyone who, in and through the Church, seeks to be the servant of God.

In our own times, we as Catholics, want to be close to her always, offer her special presents in May: pilgrimages, visits to churches dedicated to her, little sacrifices in her honour and a devotion in



reciting the Rosary. The greatest praise we can give to the Blessed Virgin is to address her loudly and clearly by the name that expresses her very highest dignity: 'Mother of God'."

During May, let us encourage our children to show special devotion to the Blessed Mother. Daily recitation of the Rosary is one way of doing so; keeping fresh flowers before the painting of the Mother and Child in your home may be another. The Litany to the Blessed Virgin may be recited in addition. Let us work together to acknowledge our Blessed Mother and to teach our children about the many benefits which can be derived from a wholesome devotion to Our Lady.
