One of our new dads (Mark) spoke on behalf of the manuhiri (visitors) sharing his excitement about the opportunity his child has to be part of our St Annes community. We look forward to many more opportunities of sharing and working together with our whanau over the term.



Matariki has been a big focus for us over the past few weeks. It signals the Māori New Year. It is a time of renewal and celebration in New Zealand that begins with the rising of the Matariki star cluster.

When is Matariki?

Matariki is a star cluster which appears in the night sky during mid-winter. According to the Maramataka (the Māori lunar calendar), the reappearance of Matariki brings the old lunar year to a close and marks the beginning of the new year. Hence, Matariki is associated with the Māori New Year.
