Fijian Language Week 2025 – Vosa Vakaviti Week



The first week in Term 4 we celebrated **Fijian Language Week** (Macawa ni Vosa Vakaviti) with our wonderful Fijian students leading us in prayer, song, and dance. The week began with a beautiful **Liturgy**, where our Fijian tamaiti (students) shared readings, prayers, and hymns in **Vosa Vakaviti**.

Each day, the students said **lotu (prayers)** before **morning tea** and **lunchtime**, reminding us of the importance of **vakavinavinaka** (gratitude) and **veilomani** (love and care for one another).

During the week, we enjoyed learning simple Fijian greetings such as:

- Bula! Hello / Welcome
- **Vinaka vakalevu** Thank you very much
- **Moce** Goodbye
- Sa malo vakalevu Well done

The highlight of the week was the **meke (traditional Fijian dance)** performed by our Fijian students. Their pride and joy shone through every movement, celebrating their language, culture, and identity.

We are so proud of our Fijian students for sharing their beautiful culture with our school. **Vinaka vakalevu** to all who helped make this week special — a true celebration of **vosa**, **vanua**, **kei na lotu** (language, land, and faith).
