#### Mercy Day

Today we celebrate Mercy Day. We are one of many schools throughout New Zealand whose charism was founded by the Mercy Sisters. Our founding story of St Anne's (*Mercy Schools Website*) starts with the Parish Priest of Manurewa, Fr Kenefick, who was invited by the Sisters of Mercy to open a convent in his Parish. He wanted to work with the many new families in the area and to teach at the new Catholic school. The Sisters agreed, and sent a small group of Sisters to set up a new community in Manurewa.

When the new school was opened in 1952 there were 60 students. The first teachers were Sr Francis Mary Rassie and Sr Mary Cletus O'Leary. Sr Cecelia Lundon taught music to many students to help earn some extra money. The Sisters were kept very busy – after teaching all day, they would often then go on 'visitation'. This meant they visited school families and other neighbours in their homes.

The school was very popular, and in 1955 a new classroom was built. In October 1990 the school shifted from Weymouth Rd to the new school in Russell Road. It has been rebuilt since in 2016 and has a roll of 584 pupils.



## **Mercy Day**



September 24 marks Mercy Day, a day with double importance for all Catholic and Mercy Schools.

In the Catholic tradition, Mercy Day is the feast of Our Lady of Mercy, the patroness of the Sisters of Mercy. Additionally, on this date is 1827 in Dublin, Ireland, Sisters of Mercy founder Catherine McAuley opened the House of Mercy. The house was a school for the education of poor young girls and a residence for homeless girls and women. The Sisters of Mercy dedicated themselves in serving people by caring for children who had no parents, caring for young women who had nowhere to live, setting up schools for poor children and caring and looking after people who were sick and dying.

Catherine McAuley chose certain Gospel values that were important to her to help her make decisions and live her life. Here at St Anne we are a proud Mercy school. We continue to work hard to instill these same Gospel Values to all the children here at St Anne so that they too can live fulfilling lives in loving God and serving others


