



It was wonderful to hear Mr Ryan at assembly, remind the children of the success and advancement in learning which they can achieve this year by consistently reading for 15-20 minutes each evening. A warm welcome back to you all and your whanau and a special welcome to new members of our community. We give thanks to our Lord for his protection over us during the holiday season.

This year our school focus and theme is "SERVING OTHERS...SERVING GOD".

"Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me." Matthew 25:40

The most beautiful and touching part about the above statement is that Jesus <u>identifies</u> Himself with the person in need, the "least" of all. By serving those in special need, we are serving Jesus. But for Him to be able to say that, He has to be intimately united with these people. And by showing such an intimate connection to them, Jesus reveals their infinite dignity as persons.

Right from the very beginning, it was always God's intention that his people should be a blessing to others. Jesus so beautifully demonstrates this in both word and action, through the stories he told, the teachings that he gave and the gift of both listening to people and healing them. He declared of himself that he 'did not come to be served, but to serve and give his life to rescue many people' (Mark 10.45). The cross was a unique and unrepeatable act of love and self-sacrifice. We too are called to experience many little deaths, as we practice the disciplines of service as we give our energy, time and resources to others.

No one serves perfectly, gives completely or works flawlessly. Basically it is important that a person knows and experiences his or her ministry as a call from the Lord. We are loved by God and called to live a life of service. Our call to service is a preeminent experience in our lives of God's love for us. We do not serve simply because it is good to do, or because it makes us feel important, or that it will prove our goodness. We serve first and most purely because in love we have been called and our response is to choose to return love. We serve because it is the Lord's call. We are created in love, called to life in service of others for it is in those we serve, we see and know the Lord.

We are blessed and privilege to have the opportunity to serve your children and families here at St Anne Catholic School. We continue to strive and work together in serving our tamariki and community with God's all encompassing love and in turn, our children will learn to serve each other with the same love.

Waitangi Day Liturgy

The treaty is an important agreement that was signed by representatives of the British Crown and Māori in 1840. The purpose of the Treaty was to enable the British settlers and the Māori people to live together in New Zealand under a common set of laws or agreements. In St Anne's School we acknowledge how significant this agreement is by celebrating Waitangi Day Liturgy, through each hub presenting their own "Hub Treaties" which they have collaboratively worked on to set expectations of how they will work together throughout the year. are Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays - they need to bring their togs, towel and goggles on those days.



Attendance Dues

Last Thursday school invoices were sent home to all families with your eldest child. If you have not received this invoice please check school bags or come to the office for another copy.

The following items are compulsory:

Stationery -

\$25 (for Year 0-4 students) \$35 (for Year 5-8 students)

Attendance Dues -

\$110.00 per child per term = \$440.00 per year for students who have started this term.

R E Digital Resource - \$6.70 per child per year

Technology - \$60 for Year 7-8 students only

The following items are donations and can be claimed back on your tax return:

Catholic Special Character - \$12.50 per term per child = \$50 per year for students who have started this term.

Support Payment - \$50 per year per family
