This module covers the Liturgical year and is designed to be used in classes at the appropriate time. It has overall Achievement Aims but each Liturgical Season and Feast Day has a separate Achievement Objectives.

ACHIEVEMENT AIMS

In their study of the Liturgical Year, children will gain and apply knowledge, skills, attitudes and values to understand:

1. The Liturgical Seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, Holy Week and Easter and their associated stories.
2. The meaning, practices and rituals of the Liturgical Seasons of the Church's Year which make present the life, death and resurrection of Jesus.
3. The meaning and significance of the symbols used when celebrating important seasons and feast days of the liturgical calendar.
4. The meaning of, and practices for what is called 'Ordinary Time' in the Liturgical Year and the Primary of Sunday as the day of the Lord's Resurrection and the day for the community to celebrate the Eucharist.
