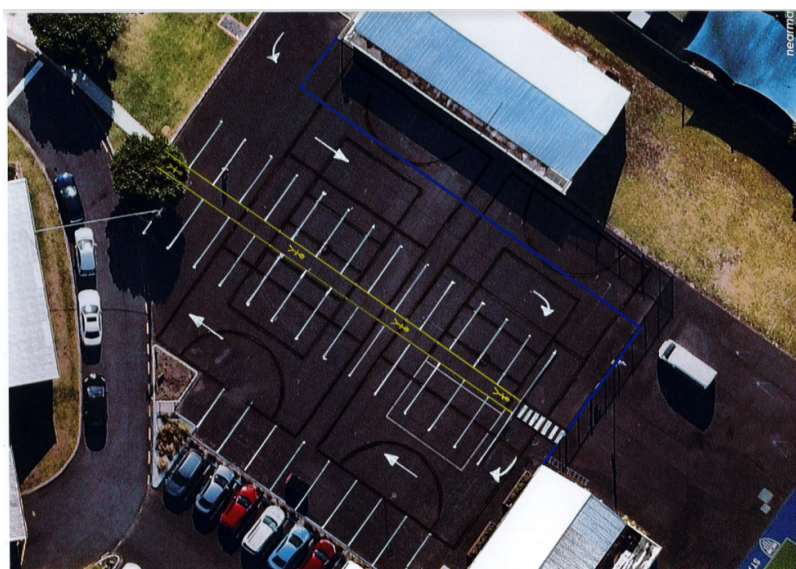

Cellphones and our Children

Our children have far more access to cellphones than ever before. This is great for communication and safety for our children, however they can cause other issues. Think of a cell phone like your child getting a car. I am sure you would support them in learning how to drive safely and responsibly. Are we doing this regarding cell phones?

Here are some simple tips to support:

Keep it Locked - set up the account with your child and set their password. Check you always have access to their phone and Apps. Remind them to keep the password to themselves.

Keep it private - Birthdays, last names, address and family details should be private and not shared online.

Keep talking - talk to your child about what is appropriate to say online. Check they are not facing online bullying or abuse.

Check their phone - certain Apps are for 13 year olds and above. However, we know our pupils are using these Apps. This is the most common place for online abuse with children.

Jesus said, “Among those born of women there has been none greater than John the Baptist” (Mt 11:11).



This Thursday is the Solemnity of the Birth of Saint John the Baptist. Each year on June 24 the Catholic Church honors the birth of John by reflecting on his unique role as the precursor of Jesus. The solemnity held on that date praises John as a worthy example of what it means to be a follower of Christ.

John the Baptist was Jesus' cousin, and he baptised Jesus in the Jordan River. John led a simple life. He was only concerned with the Kingdom of God and always spoke of love and truth. He is a model of how to live a life in Christ.

John the Baptist's parents were Zechariah and Elizabeth. Elizabeth was related to Jesus' mother, Mary.

Mary visited Elizabeth when Elizabeth was pregnant with John. John, filled with the Holy Spirit, leapt with joy in Elizabeth's womb when Mary greeted her relative.

Elizabeth understood that the child Mary

carried was to be the Son of God.

John taught those who followed him to turn to Christ. He called Jesus the “Lamb of God” (John 1:29). In all that John did, he pointed his followers toward Christ instead of calling attention to himself. In the Gospel of John, we read that some Pharisees questioned John: “Why then do you baptise if you are not the Messiah or Elijah or the Prophet?” John answered them, “I baptise with water; but there is one among you whom you do not recognise, the one who is coming after me, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to untie” (John 1:25–27).

John lived a humble life. We can adopt this same humility in our own lives. When we do good works, we should do them out of love and in God's name, not for our personal recognition or gain.

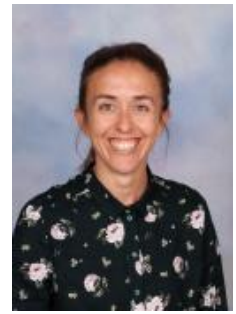
