This Friday we look forward to celebrating our first Full School Mass of the term. Being able to celebrate our faith together and in community, is just a special part of who we are. Our faith is the bond that brings us together and living the Gospel values is what we want for all our faith community.

How are we going with attendance?

It was great to see your commitment in having your children at school each day last term. From Weeks 4 to 9 we averaged 90% attendance each week. This would mean approximately 470 pupils out of 520 attending each day. This was greater than in 2022.

Let's keep that going as we head into the winter term. It may seem easier to leave the children at home when it rains, however it does affect them. Being away often can cause anxiety in pupils, loss of confidence in their learning, and in themselves. We both want them to love school and we know education is the key to success.

It will rain on some mornings this term and yes, the pupils will need to walk to their Hub. However, it is only a short walk until they are in a nice and warm Hub and mixing with their friends. Everyday is precious and we are keen to give them great teaching each day.

In Term 1, 60% (291 pupils) attended school over 90% of the time. These pupils were absent from 1-5 days during the 10 weeks. We know we can get that higher. Let's aim for less than 5 Days (1 week) Absent from all pupils this term. The challenge is on.

It is now **Week 3 of Term 2** and it is great to see most children taking pride in their appearance and wearing the correct St Anne's Catholic School winter uniform.

The reasons outlined for a school uniform are:

- 1. To develop a sense of belonging
- 2. To give a sense of identity and pride in that identity.
- 3. To develop equality among all the children regardless of social standing.
- 4. To develop pride, self-esteem and confidence through neat presentation affected by the wearing of a uniform.

Our school uniform is now sold online at www.argyleonline.co.nz - click on Shop ArgyleOnLine and select our school name under the Auckland heading. The online instructions are easy to follow, orders can be placed anytime and you can pay using a Credit or Debit card or online banking. Orders are expected to be delivered within 3-5 working days to the address you choose.

Other items of uniform:

- Only black or brown shoes should be worn in winter months (Term 2 & Term 3)
- Earrings should be studs only.
- Children with long hair should have it tied up in a black, white or navy hair tie/clip/headband.
- No nail polish to be worn at school
- No nose rings or anklets are permitted in our policy.
- Greenstone, crosses, crucifixes are fine to be worn under the shirt.
 - Children are able to wear culturally significant items ONLY if they bring to school a letter from an elder, church minister etc family items are not to be worn.

Slippers


The St Anne's Parish Knitting group has a large amount of odd balls of yarn and carpet wool.
