Community of Learning

Our school is a part of a Catholic Schools Community of Learning (COL). The schools involved are De La Salle College, Holy Cross Papatoetoe, Holy Trinity Takanini, St Anne's Manurewa, St John's Otara, St Joseph's Pukekohe, St Mary MacKillop Mangere and St Mary's Papakura. The aim of the COL is to provide professional development aimed at raising teacher capability in areas such as writing, maths, digital literacy and cultural responsiveness.

This year our priority areas for development are in writing, especially focusing on raising the writing achievement of our boys, our Maori and Pasifika students. We believe by sharing, supporting and challenging each other we can raise achievement. Our 2016 COL writing data has already improved by 3.8% for our students in Year 1 - 8 and 7% for our boys meeting the National Standards compared to 2015. We look forward to further gains over time.

We are fortunate as a COL to have a shared Catholic culture, that means we work from a common set of values and our Principals and staff share a commitment to raising achievement within a strong Catholic faith environment.



Within our Religious Education programme, we are now beginning the Church Strand. We will be exploring many concepts, including;

- *Church* is a community of disciples (followers) called together by the Holy Spirit. We often think of 'church' as the name of a *building*, whereas in its truest sense it is *people* coming together to continue the mission of Jesus. As a Catholic School, we too are church.
- Eucharist (communion) is our main form of worship.
- *'Catholic'* means universal. The Catholic Church is for all people, and it is committed to working for the unity of all Christians.
- Understanding the organisation and structure of the New Zealand Catholic Church; eg dioceses, parishes, Pope, bishops, priests, clergy etc
- As members of the Church, we are called to carry out its mission of service

Within Religious Education we are learning about the Catholic Church of Aotearoa.

Did you know...

- The first Bishop of New Zealand was French. His name was Bishop Jean Baptiste Francois Pompallier. He celebrated the first Mass in New Zealand at Totara Point in Hokianga on January 13th 1838.
- Bishop Pompallier intervened at the signing of the Treaty of Waitangi (6th February 1840) to ensure a guarantee of religious freedom for all was obtained.
- The first Maori priest was Father Wiremu Te Awhitu and the first Maori Bishop was Bishop Max Takuira Matthew Mariu (who died in 2005).
