facilitator for the Christchurch cluster). This highly regarded programme has been delivered to 300 schools since 2003 throughout New Zealand. It has been very positively received by our teacher aides and learners who have participated in the programme so far. The training programme will continue for the next two terms. Our ELA team will graduate at the end of the year after completing six full-day workshops, six in-school visits by the Auckland Cluster facilitators, and six inter-workshop tasks.
