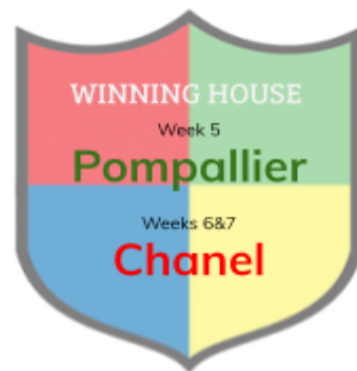

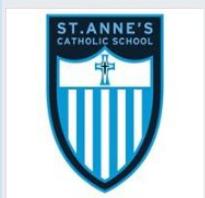
That being said we are still training hard for our St Anne's Shield competition that will take place in Week 10. Take a look at some of the photos from training this week.
