

The online instructions are easy to follow, orders can be placed anytime and you can pay using a Credit or Debit card or online banking. Orders are expected to be delivered within 3-5 working days to the address you choose.

We have a reasonable supply of second hand uniforms in the library (not all sizes available). Please see Mrs Downes or Mrs Watson if you would like to see what is available - we are happy to give you this at no cost.

We would also appreciate any of your school uniform items that no longer fit your child. These can be left at the school office or library so that we can also pass these items on to our families.
